

Government Injection of HK\$6,000 into Eligible MPF/ORSO Scheme Members' Accounts

Injection Timetable, Review of Eligibility and Appeal Mechanism

1. Injection Timetable

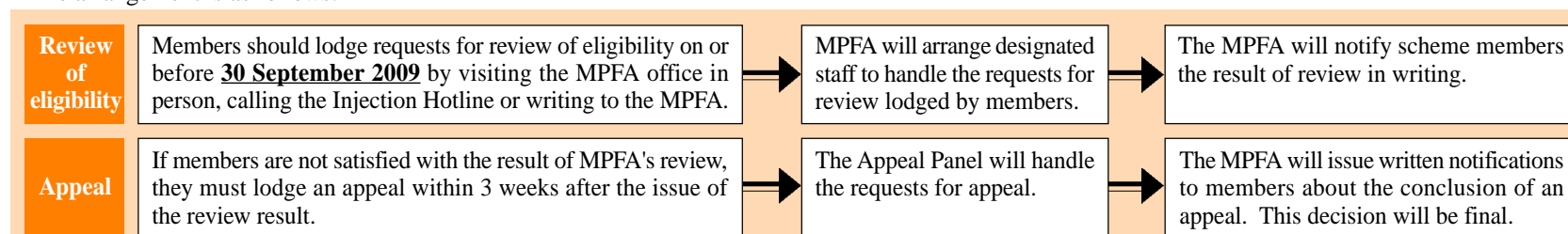
Following the approval of funding application by the Finance Committee of Legislative Council, the MPFA has instructed the trustees to commence injecting the contributions into MPF accounts of eligible members by batches from March. Members should take note of the following timetable, so as to estimate the time to receive the contributions or take actions if necessary:

| Dates | MPF Members & ORSO Scheme Members (with MPF accounts) | ORSO Scheme Members (without MPF accounts) |

| March 2009 | — | Trustees concerned will send MPF information kits with application/enrolment forms to eligible members for them to open MPF preserved accounts for receiving the contributions and choose investment options. |
| March - April 2009* | Contributions will be injected into the accounts of eligible members (please refer to overleaf of this flyer for injection arrangements for different scheme members). Trustees will issue written notifications to relevant members within 10 working days after completion of injection. | — |
| On or before 31 March 2009 | — | Members must return the completed application/enrolment form for opening an MPF preserved account to the trustees concerned. |
| April 2009 onwards | — | Contributions will be injected into members' MPF preserved accounts. Trustees will issue written notifications to relevant members within 10 working days after completion of injection. |
| April - September 2009 | If members consider themselves eligible but have not received trustees' notification, they can lodge their requests for review of eligibility on or before 30 September 2009 by visiting the MPFA Kwun Tong office (25/F, Tower 1, Millennium City 1, 388 Kwun Tong Road, Kwun Tong, Kowloon) in person, calling the Injection Hotline or writing to the MPFA. | |
| 30 September 2009 | Members who wish to apply for review of eligibility must lodge such requests on or before 30 September 2009 . Any late request will not be considered. | |
| Subject to the date when the result of review is issued | If members are not satisfied with the result of a review for eligibility, they must lodge an appeal with justification within 3 weeks after the issue of the review result. Any late submission of appeal request will not be considered (please refer to Part 2 below for the review and appeal mechanism). | |

* For members who have transferred the accrued benefits of their MPF Target account to another trustee recently, the date on which the contributions will be injected into their accounts may be affected (please refer to the flowchart overleaf on how to determine the "Target account").

2. Review of Eligibility and Appeal Mechanism

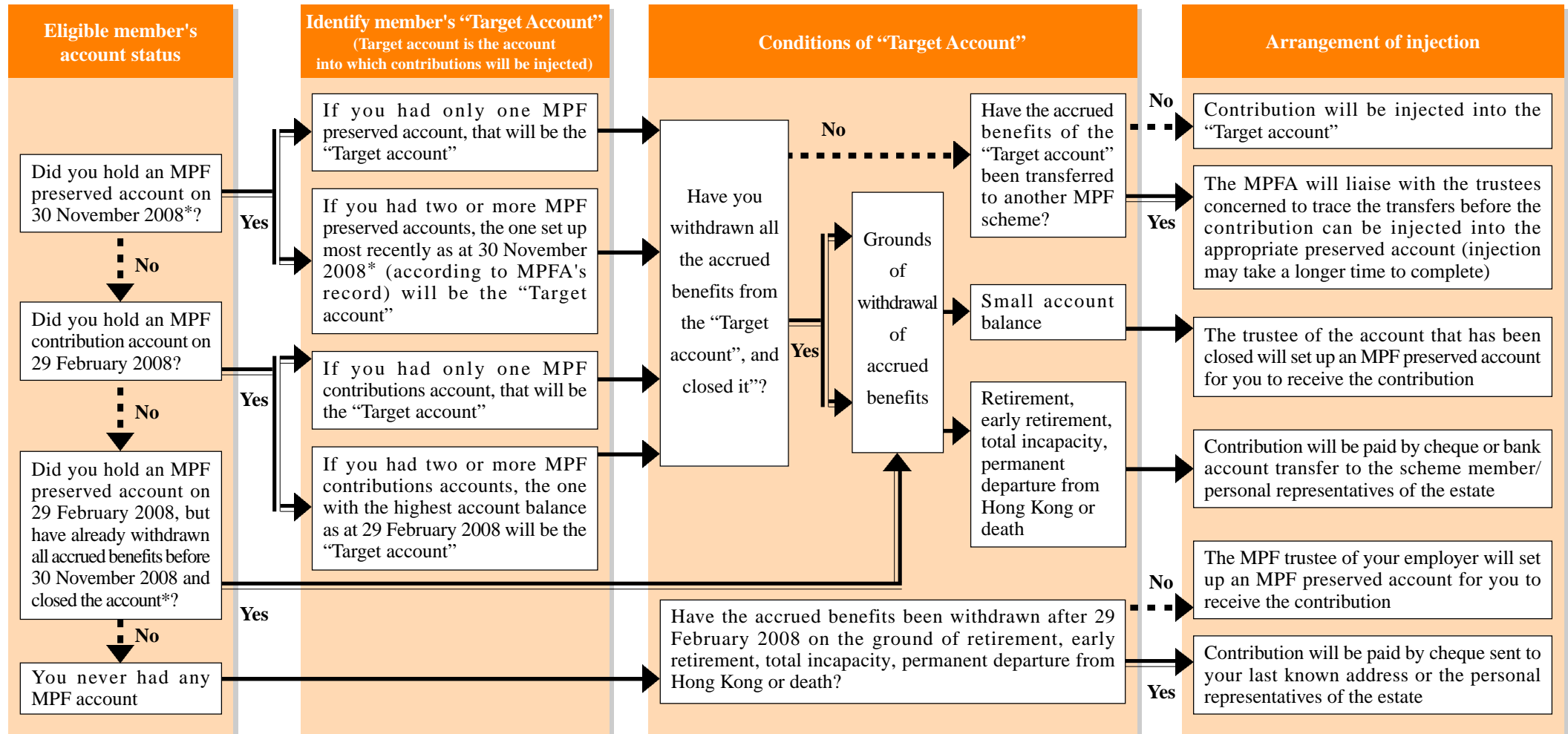
If members wish to apply for review of eligibility, they must lodge such requests on or before **30 September 2009**. Any late request for review will not be considered. The arrangement is as follows:

Injection Arrangement

The contributions will be injected by batches in March and April. The MPFA will inject the contributions into members' MPF preserved accounts. If members do not possess any MPF preserved accounts but only have MPF contribution accounts, the contributions will be injected into their contribution accounts. For members who do not have any MPF accounts, the trustees concerned will set up MPF preserved accounts for them to receive the contributions. If members have already withdrawn their accrued benefits on statutory grounds, contributions will be paid by cheque or bank transfer. Eligible members may make reference to the following flowchart to better understand the injection arrangement for members with different accounts:



* To allow sufficient time for administrative arrangement, the MPFA has taken 30 November 2008 as the cut-off date for trustees to submit information on preserved accounts for deciding into which preserved account the contributions will be injected.
